- -- Motion to approve 04-20-2022 Water Committee Meeting Minutes by Larry L., 2nd by Jay. Approved 4-0
- -- DP -- Presented draft of Agenda for Public Meeting Saturday 5/7 based on previous meeting's discussion
- -- All -- Reviewed and agreed who will be leading each section
- -- CC -- Is updating the Water System Block Diagram and will bring copies plus a larger display version
- -- CC -- Asked for feedback re: sample Pump House data sheets
- -- LL -- Need to add more details Mfg, Model, Age, etc.
- -- CC -- That detail is being added
- -- CC -- Status of tasks:
 - -- Hydro CAD Model is about 75% complete

Verifying elevations; including data from the Tour

Will calibrate in the Field – OK to do this after 5/31

-- Data Collection & Condition Assessment:

This is essentially complete

Need to do the write-up

- -- JB -- Will work on gathering additional system updates that were not covered in the Tourg
- -- RL -- The Capital Improvement Plan #'s are beyond what the District can handle It is a question of what is feasible
- -- CC -- That was the very early first Draft the numbers will be refined
 - -- There is more infrastructure money available for the next few years than she has EVER seen before
 - -- System improvements should result in lower maintenance costs
 - -- Does expect the Asset Management Plan to be approved by NH-DES
- -- CC -- AMP Task 4: Financial Planning
 - -- Funding Sources: the SRF Pre-Application has been done
 - -- Need conversations re: what is affordable
 - -- AMP Task 5: Compile into the report
 - -- Draft to Commissioners, Water Committee, NH-DES
 - -- Will schedule one more public meeting for a review of the final AMP
 - -- NH-DES may allow this to be presented in June
 - -- Will prepare a slide presentation
 - -- Current value of the VDOE Water System is about \$23 million
 - -- After all work is complete, the AMP with all exhibits will be uploaded to the website
- -- CC -- Mission Statement drafts were provided
- -- LS -- The longer version is close to what is in the Water System Ordinance
- -- RL -- How did Horizons determine that 19% of pipes are in poor quality?
- -- CC -- This was NOT via an in-ground assessment there were no funds available for that work
 - -- Looked at lines with bleeders, lines which had experienced breaks, age, etc.
- -- LL -- How much water loss is currently associated with bleeders?

- -- LS -- We would probably have to measure with a bucket to evaluate
- -- CC -- August is the highest usage month
 - -- The seasonality of the community makes it very difficult to figure out water loss
- -- RL -- What are the highest priority Capital Improvement Projects?
- -- CC -- It looks like they should be:
 - -- Chocorua Pump House
 - -- Bergamo
 - -- DPW well & pumps
 - -- Summit Building
 - -- Two storage tanks
- -- LL -- Muddy Beach was built without a vapor barrier and floor
 - -- Have had to add a dehumidifier, which is expensive this should be a priority
- -- CC -- Will show a "Top Ten" list of CIP's
 - -- Can easily reprioritize within the list as circumstances evolve
- -- RL -- What about Leak Detection?
- -- LL -- Need to apply for the NH-DES Leak Detection Grant
- -- CC -- For now, can use data from Ian's leak repairs

Zoom ended at 3:00pm. CC & LS dropped off.

- -- JB -- 91-A Request re: comment made by LS about Grants at Commissioners meeting
- -- LL -- NH-DES indicated that to be able to have a high enough priority in the Applicants List to get non-matching Grants, VDOE <u>must</u> have an AMP in place
- -- JB -- LS will have to answer for his comment
- -- RL -- Questioned the estimate of value at \$23 million
 - -- Book Value is way lower ("Depreciated")
- -- RL -- CIP Priorities how did CC come up with this?
- -- JB -- Info that Ian gave to CC is not completely accurate as it is coming from his memory of events
 - -- Ian may not be keeping his own system map completely up-to-date
- -- RL -- The Draft AMP Report does not address potential build-out (i.e., new houses)
 Especially where there are small 2" lines
- -- ?? -- Possible additional LOS entry for Operations: should all gate valves be exercised (every 3 years)?
- -- LL -- Horizons is capturing data in AutoCAD; will make available in GIS, spreadsheets, hard copy
 - -- VDOE does not have a GIS system, but the data will be ready when VDOE does add that capability
 - -- NH-DES is exploring GIS systems, trying to find a good, reasonable-cost system that could be used state-wide
- -- DP -- Next week, we need to schedule a meeting with Ian to try to identify missing system updates CC wants to join that meeting with Devon
- -- JB -- Will contact Ian
- -- Motion to adjourn by DP, 2nd by JB Approved 3-0
